THE GRAND COMMANDERY OF KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE STATE OF OHIO October 2024

The 182nd Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Ohio was held on October 10, 11 and 12, 2024 at the Crowne Plaza Columbus North.

Sir Knight Richard L. Ganion, our Right Eminent Grand Commander, presided. He and our Grand Officers entered between lines formed by Sir Knights from the several Divisions.

All sixty-three Constituent Commanderies of this Grand Commandery were represented. All of the Grand Officers were present. All of our living Past Grand Commanders were present except Sir Knights Richard L. Weaver, David M. Snyder, Richard M. Holcombe, S. Thomas Ramsay, Richard J. Brady, Thomas H. Gault and Terry L. Wymer.

Attendance was reported as follows: Grand Officers 28; Past Grand Commanders 10; Commanders 44; Generalissimos 19; Captains General 21; Past Commanders 87 and 2 Proxies, giving us 211 voting delegates. We also had 13 non-voting members of Ohio Commanderies and 18 out of state guests.

We had many Distinguished guests from Ohio and out of state, plus the Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, SK Jeffrey A. Bolstad, our own Past Grand Master from Ohio, SK William H. Koon II, and our East Central Department Commander, SK Jay P. Kennedy. All of the distinguished guests were afforded the proper Templar honors, including our Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio, SK Paul A. Weglage.

182nd Grand Commandery Finance Report Grand Conclave 2024 – Richard L Ganion, REPGC

These sessions are becoming very expensive; room and food costs are going through the roof lately.

In my travels, and conversing with my counterparts, a common thread was the exorbitant expenses of comps, both room and meals. There needs to be a serious conversation on ways to reduce these – it is 'nice' to pay for guests, but that courtesy comes at a significant cost. I am hopeful, now that we are disconnecting the drill competition from the Grand Commandery session, that a number of these comps will be eliminated/reduced in the future.

Investment earnings did well during the past 12 months. A 9.05% increase is strong given the difficult 1st quarter, we had this year.

Note we distributed \$22,000 in scholarships and the Scholarship fund still increased \$17,000.

We have paid out Life Memberships of \$4,397 but still had an increase of \$10,800 in that fund.

The Membership & Memorial Account (Our Endowed Membership Fund) added 12 new Sir Knights at \$1,200/ Sir Knight We also distributed \$5,030 to our Commanderies. Adjusting for the above additions and deletions, we still had a positive value increase in excess of \$16,000.

The Grand Commandery of Ohio is on very solid footing at this time.

Grand Recorder's Report

It is once again time for me to report on the activities of the Grand Recorder for the past year. Four years ago, because of covid, you received digital copies of the Pre-printed Report, but the Grand Officers believe we should provide hard copies of the reports and have done so since then.

Five years ago, we informed you that we had accomplished a long-desired goal by digitizing ALL of our Grand Proceedings and had them available on the following website - http://gwm.lunaimaging.com/luna/servlet. We also made them available on a flash drive that individuals and/or Commanderies could purchase for \$15.00. For those that purchased a flash drive, each year you can obtain the current year's Proceedings from the Grand Commandery website and add it to your flash drive or you can get it from the website mentioned above. We still have a few of the flash drives available at a cost of \$15.00/each. Digitizing and maintaining the above website was, and continues to be a project of the George Washington Masonic Memorial.

I am indebted to our Recorders for they are the mainstay in our Commanderies. The other officers come and go, generally serving only one or two years but that faithful Recorder serves MULTIPLE years. Please be sure to thank your Recorder for all he does. I especially appreciate those Recorders who respond quickly to emails, phone calls, other communications and get reports in promptly.

Because I have felt the strong support of not only the Grand Commandery Officers and Past Grand Commanders but also of the Sir Knights throughout this Grand Commandery, I have continued to serve in this capacity. And because of that strong support I continue to enjoy serving.

We especially thank the widows of our Past Grand Commanders for they served right along with their husbands and gave willingly of their time and talents. Please thank them when you have a chance. Their notes are always appreciated. We wish they could attend more of our functions but we also understand their reasons, mostly health and distance keep them away.

We are blessed by the long and faithful service of our dedicated Past Grand Commanders. They not only served through the officer line of this Great Grand Commandery but continue to serve in many ways. We are always pleased when they can join us and are saddened when age and health make that impossible. Please keep them in your thoughts and prayers.

MMS – This is the Grand Encampment database and it is wonderful and very user friendly, but only if you use it on a regular basis. The more you use it the more you will like it. When you as a Recorder have questions I encourage you to call me and we will both get onto the system while we talk on the phone – this to me, is the very best way to learn the "ins and outs" of the system. If a Recorder has trouble getting onto the system he should call John Elkinton in the Grand Encampment office (713-349-8700) – he usually answers all questions the same day and generally within the hour. One thing that you must remember – when entering information into MMS, the date it is entered is what is important, rather than the date the event occurred. The Grand Commandery of Ohio uses the dates of June 1 – May 31 as the Commandery year. If you wait until June 3 to enter information it goes on the NEXT year's business.

I continue to use e-mail almost exclusively to communicate with the Recorders and the Commanderies. I will always respond to your e-mails, even if it is a simple "thanks". If you do not get a response within a day or two, that means I did not get it. I have two primary e-mails: jam@main-net.com and grandrecorder@ohioknightstemplar.com. I have two phones. My home

phone is 937-465-3202 and my cell is 937-508-8922. If I don't answer, please leave a message and I will get back with you. My home phone continues to be the most reliable.

During Grand Commandery I have an office at the hotel and encourage you to stop by to visit, to see what is available to buy and to go through the MANY items available for a donation to the Holy Land Pilgrimage Fund. During Grand Commandery the office is staffed by Bob and Del Hager, our Associate Grand Recorder and his wife, and my wife and me – we enjoy visiting with you when you stop in and there are always extra chairs for you to take a break. With our change of schedule this year I do not have a handle on when the office will be open but we will be there as much as we can.

I have a packet for each Recorder at Grand Commandery in my office – please stop by to get it and if the Recorder of your Commandery is not at Grand Commandery, please see that a member of your Commandery picks it up for him. It will contain 50, 60 and 65-year pins, cards and certificates for your Sir Knights that are eligible for these awards. With it will be two copies of the new Roster – one for the Recorder and one for the Commander. I urge you to get these veterans pins presented as soon as possible if they live reasonably close. It is preferred that they be presented at a Commandery Conclave but if not possible, it is hoped that it can be presented personally in the Sir Knight's home. If they live out of state, please mail them out promptly. Our Grand Officers are only too happy to be involved with these presentations if you make them aware of the dates.

We no longer mail out to every Grand Officer and every Commandery hard copies of the Grand Proceedings. They are available in the Grand Recorder's Office at Grand Commandery but it is YOUR responsibility to stop in and pick one up, if you want a hard copy. As you know they are now available on line as explained at the beginning of this report.

Supplies -I try to keep a stock of the supplies you may need and will normally ship them out within a day or two. I will also usually e-mail you the invoice as soon as I know the postage. I also have a large supply of items in my office here at the hotel.

Rosters – Each Commandery has one for the Commander and another for the Recorder. Additional copies are available for \$3.00 each if you see me, but if I have to mail them they will be \$5.00.

Office – during the year it is in our home. I encourage you to call any time between 6:30 AM and 10:00 PM.

PAYROLL – Each Commandery that is present at Grand Commandery is entitled to mileage and per diem and the checks will be handed out by me and Bob Hager on Friday afternoon, AFTER the close of Grand Commandery. The highest-ranking officer of the Commandery must get a payroll card from the Registration Committee which will be exchanged for the check. Proxies have nothing to do with the mileage and per diem check. Proxies are only for voting.

Mail – I have generally had excellent service from USPS but sometimes they are SLOW. Please try not to send anything to me that requires a signature – if I am not home it requires me to drive quite a distance and get to the post office within a two-hour window. I think many of you could save your Commandery a great deal of money by mailing first-class rather than some of the more expensive methods that the Post Office is only too willing to sell you. The Postal Service like everyone else is short-handed and the mail may take a few extra days. I have also found that the extra you pay generally does NOT make a difference.

CITATION CORDS – When a Sir Knight is eligible for a new cord the Recorder must fill out a request (available on line or from me) and send it to me by mail or preferably electronically, and I will send the cord to the Recorder. Even if you as the Recorder have a cord to present to

him, the Recorder should send me an Application so that we can keep a record of who has what cord. These cords do not usually show much wear and can be reused many times. The CITATION CORD program is entirely separate from the Grand Encampment Membership Program – for that program the individual has to STILL be a member of Commandery.

ELECTION RETURNS and ANNUAL RETURNS – These are two entirely different forms. In both cases, please be sure to use the CURRENT form, not one you dig out from previous years. The ELECTION RETURN is a very simple fillable pdf form that should only take a few minutes to complete and should be sent to me electronically. It tells me who is elected to the various offices in your Commandery and the information is used to complete the Grand Commander's Roster. It should be completed immediately after election – do not wait until installation. You should also send a copy of it to your DC and DDC.

The ANNUAL RETURN is a report of the PREVIOUS year's activity for your Commandery. It has NOTHING to do with your Annual Election and can be filled out immediately after May 31 as that is the cutoff date for all activity for the year. The officers listed on page 3 are LAST YEAR's officers. This form is a fillable pdf and all calculations are done for you. All the information on this form can be verified by looking at MMS, because unless you have entered it in MMS by May 31, it cannot be included on your Annual Return. I prefer that you send the ANNUAL RETURN to me digitally. I will then look it over and either tell you I agree with all of your figures or will make the needed corrections – then you can send me your check.

OUR OHIO STATUTES are available from me electronically, only. We do not have printed copies as there are changes almost every year. I can email you the most current version any time you request it. If you want to print it, that is fine but it will take several pages. The most current is dated October 2022. If we pass any legislation at this session the Statutes will be updated and available within the month.

RITUALS – Our Rituals are all in plain English – no code, and are available in either spiral bound or hard bound. The spiral bound are \$10.00 each and the hard bound are \$11.00 each.

TACTICS - These were updated in 2016 and are available in printed form or digitally – inserts only are \$5.00, with binders they are \$10.00. Any tactics that show a date prior to 2016 should have been destroyed long ago.

COMMANDERY YEARS – we use many different years which can be quite confusing.

Grand Encampment –

Member wise – Jan. 1 – Dec. 31

Fiscally they use triennial to triennial

Proposed Legislation

ESTABLISHMENT OF OHIO KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CHARITY FUND

We hereby establish the Ohio Knight Templar Charity Fund. This fund will be established with \$522,000.00 transferred from the Grand Commandery Cash Management Fund. The earnings in this account can be used for charitable causes for Ohio Knights Templar, their wives, their widows, their children, individual Commanderies, the Ohio Masonic Communities, or other items to be considered by the Grand Commandery Relief Committee. The Relief Committee shall be established with 5 Sir Knights, originally appointed for terms of 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 years. Each new appointment thereafter shall be for a 5-year term. No Knight may serve more that 2 consecutive terms. The Long-Range Planning Committee shall recommend Sir Knights, who will be appointed by the Grand Commander. No more than 1 elected Grand Commandery Officer shall be appointed. There shall be one additional appointee from the ranks of appointed Grand Commandery officers. Another appointee shall be from the ranks of Division Commander or Deputy Division Commander. 2 additional Sir Knights shall come from the remaining Ohio Sir Knights who have been elected to serve their Commandery as a dais officer.

No contributions shall be made from this fund to support existing Grand Commandery of Ohio or Grand Encampment charities such as the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, the Holy Land Pilgrimage, or the Knight Templar Educational Fund.

The initial corpus is NOT to be diminished. In the event market declines shall cause the corpus to fall below \$522,000.00, there shall be no distributions until the market gains allow the initial corpus to be restored.

Report on Uniform Audits

In accordance with the General Orders, every Commandery in the Grand Commandery of Ohio is required to complete a Uniform Audit Report for their Commandery. The audit was to be completed and submitted to the Deputy Division Commander by July 1, 2025, for review by him and the Division Commander. Once their reviews were complete and corrections made, they were required to be submitted to either the Grand Captain General (1-39) or the Grand Senior Warden (40-84) by August 1, 2025. Unfortunately, as of August 1, 2025, less than 50% of the Commanderies had been submitted. There are still several Commanderies, as of the writing of this partial report on August 30, 2025, which still do not have UAR's submitted.

The main issue with the UAR's received is that required signatures were missing. Many times, there were signed forms but those were not the ones submitted. Math errors were limited when the auto-fill function on the form is used.

The General Orders further require the Grand Captain General and Grand Senior Warden are responsible for reviewing the UARs, uploading archive copies to the designated electronic storage site and reporting to the Right Eminent Grand Commander and Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander on any Commanderies that have assets less than \$1,000.00 OR had total assets decrease during the year by more than 5%. After a review of the UAR's submitted to date none of the Commanderies reviewed had assets less than \$1,000.00 and only two Commandries had decreases of more than 5%. A full accounting will be submitted to the Grand Commander and the Deputy Grand Commander when all reports have been received.

Knights Templar Eye Foundation Report on the 57th Voluntary Campaign

The 57th Voluntary Campaign is in the books, and once again the Sir Knights and Ohio's constituent commanderies contributed generously and greatly to it success

Ohio ranked sixth throughout Grand Encampment in dollars contributed during this campaign, which ended April 30th, 2025. Sir Knights and commanderies contributed \$77,296.50 as part of the \$1,877,594.49 given from all jurisdictions toward research for the prevention of blindness. Ohio is ranked second overall with a total of \$583,046.50 in contributions plus trust plus wills.

Northwestern Division
